



JANA HALTMAROVÁ

Plant Manager

Jana has been working as Plant Manager for 10 years already, but she joined SMS (formerly Wistron) in 2007. She was one of the first employees of the repair center of Wistron InfoComm (Czech) s. r. o. in the Czech Republic.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN WORKING AT SMS AND FOR WHAT POSITION YOU WERE ORIGINALLY HIRED?

It's been 15 years now, during which I have went through the positions at BSO department and as a BSO Manager, WH Manager to my current position of Plant Manager.

WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU HAD TO FACE DURING THE TIME AT THE COMPANY?

Certainly, the biggest challenge was and is to build and maintain a good team of employees who work well together and enjoy working together. This is the absolute foundation that will help us solve other challenges such as the company's relocation, the pandemic, rising energy prices and more.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN WORKING AT SMS AND FOR WHAT POSITION YOU WERE ORIGINALLY HIRED?

I remember my first day at SMS. I started as a BSO (I was recruited by Jana), it was Monday and everyone (four people) in the office was talking mainly about the company teambuilding, which was last friday and how great it was. So I thought, this place should be great. Well, it's been great for the 13th year now.

WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU HAD TO FACE DURING THE TIME AT THE COMPANY?

It was definitely the beginning of the current HP project. It was a challenge to understand and set it all up for everyone who worked or is working at HP in any way. Take the kids for a swim at the Silver Lake. It's a flooded gypsum mine and nobody calls it anything but "Sadrak", but the swimming and the surroundings are great. And if you see a few concrete bunkers around, don't be alarmed. Yes, you're on the border with Poland and as my dad says jokingly, *"Yeah, it's a tough north up here".*



WHAT DID YOU WANT TO BE WHEN YOU WERE A KID?

I remember when we were told at school to draw what we wanted to be when we grew up, I drew a big green rectangle and there was a little person standing next to it. Then I explained to the teacher that I wanted to be a printer. But that didn't stick with me for long. Otherwise, I don't think I'm one of those people who knows what they're gonna do when they grow up.

WHAT WAS YOUR FIRST JOB AFTER GRADUATING UNIVERSITY?

That's easy. Wistron and then SMS. So I'm still loyal to one company. But I'm sure I was influenced a lot by going to the US every summer for 3 months to work. Even if it was dishwashing, bellman in a hotel or a fast food cook, it taught me a lot for the future.

WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE FOOD?

MICHAL JOINED A HISTORICAL FENCING GROUP AROUND 2017. HE ATTENDED A FEW EVENTS AND LIKED IT SO MUCH THAT HE STARTED PARTICIPATING AT LEAST AS A NON-COMBAT CHARACTER. AFTER A COUPLE OF YEARS, HE EVENTUALLY GOT INTO THE "DOBA KARLOVA (ENG CHARLES' AGE)" PROJECT, WHICH AIMS TO SIMULATE LIFE AND COMBAT IN THE SECOND HALF OF THE 14TH CENTURY AS CLOSELY AS POSSIBLE.

WHAT LED YOU TO HISTORICAL FENCING?

About five years ago, my roommate took me with him to a historical fencing training for the first time. Since then, I have been irregularly participating in various events under the flag of our troop. Each event is an opportunity to get away from the regular stereotype of everyday life and experience something new. What I enjoy most about it is meeting completely different people, among whom I have made a lot of great friends. I have to say, they can be pretty challenging sometimes, but you definitely don't get bored with them. As they say, "You don't need enemies if you have a fencer as a friend."

HOW WOULD YOU DESCRIBE YOUR HOBBY?

BOOK REVIEWS by Anička

My name is Anna, I read critically, and I can be cynical and ruthless in my reflections. If I like a book, however, I care for it like the Little Prince cares for his Rose. I spend my evenings talking to it and I give it presents for Christmas. For this issue of SMS magazine, I've prepared a little book tasting that are guaranteed to receive something from me as a Christmas gift.

ALONE IN TOKYO – MARIE MACHYTKOVA

This autobiographical story about a great love for a foreign country and culture is one of the best books published by Albatros Media this year. Alone in Tokyo is a hauntingly intimate confession of atypical love, trauma, adulthood and difficult life choices. I originally expected the book to be a humorous novel about life in Japan, but I got a very different emotional cocktail and I'm glad for it. Machytkova describes how one impulsive decision changed the course of her entire life, opening up and letting the reader see inside a determined woman with her feet firmly on the ground.





HOUSE IN THE CERULEAN SEA - TJ KLUNE

This book is mistakenly promoted as an LGBT novel, but it is actually a sweet fantasy story filled with metaphors, allegories and other soulful expressions that will stimulate you to think about change, society, attitudes to life and determinism. The book is all laced with light, charming humor and full of characters you'll love. Linus Baker is a member of the Department for work with Magical Youth. He loves his job and is good at it. He follows rules and guidelines very closely, and is generally about as mentally flexible as the staff of a retirement home in the Vatican. He is only snapped out of his ossified ideas about life when he meets some dangerously unique children, including the Antichrist himself, with whom he spends a month on an isolated island in a very special orphanage.

FISHERMAN-JOHN LANGAN

The Fisherman is one of the most challenging and accomplished horror films of recent times. The book is definitely not the right fit for an impatient reader. In fact, the whole book is written in a monologue form, so it's definitely more suited for patient people who enjoy slowburn. Fans of Stephen King will appreciate the moments of male bonding we know from, say, Duma Key Island or Animal Graveyard, and the final section is simply spectacular and riveting. The author has spun revolutions of the imagination over the story of the mysterious ageless fisherman that would make even a centrifuge blush.



Let's save energy consumption together



Energy prices are rising, energy suppliers are going bankrupt and people and businesses are being forced to switch to unfavorable and expensive contracts. Electricity represents up to 25% of all energy consumption. As we have been dealing with the topic of sustainable consumption and reducing greenhouse gas production for some time, now we have some tips related to saving of energy consumption and costs in these uncertain times. Just follow a few simple rules and your family will save up to a third of your monthly expenses.

1. DON'T WASTE BY HEATING MORE THAN YOU NEED TO

Reducing the room temperature by 1 °C saves up to 6% of heating energy! Close the doors to rooms that you do not need to heat or in which you keep a lower temperature. Insulating the building well and reducing heat leakage by insulating doors, windows and thresholds will also help a lot.





2. GET A THERMOSTAT OR THERMOSTATIC VALVES

With modern thermostats you can set the temperature exactly as you want: higher in the evening, lower during the day and at night. For longer periods of time you are away just temper the room. If you don't have your own thermostat-controlled boiler, install thermostatic control valves.

3. WATCH OUT FOR COVERED HEATERS

Never cover heating devices with curtains, clothes, furniture or anything else





4. VENTILATE BRIEFLY AND INTENSIVELY

When ventilating in winter, it is a good idea to open the windows wide for a short time. This way, the air is removed quickly and the walls stay warm.

5. AVOID AIR-CONDITIONING

During hot summer days, it helps to change the ventilation scheme (only in the morning and evening when it is not hot) and during the day keep the windows closed and shaded.





6. THE REFRIGERATOR SHOULD BE PLACED IN A COOL PLACE

If the fridge or freezer is placed next to a heat source (heater, cooker, oven), it consumes more electricity for cooling. Every extra degree Celsius in the surrounding area means an increase in consumption of around 4%. When a frost builds up in the freezer, electricity consumption starts to rise rapidly and it is therefore recommended to defrost it regularly.

At work, at home

7. GET LED LIGHTS

LED lights are even more economical and environmentally friendly than compact fluorescent lamps and they don't mind frequent switching off and last many times longer.





8. HOW TO SAVE WHEN COOKING

Use a lid when cooking. Use only the necessary amount of water. The fastest and least wasteful way to heat water is in a kettle. If you want to save money, get a cooker with an induction hob.

9. TURN OFF THE LIGHTS

You already know this advice; lighting consumes up to a tenth of the electricity in a home, so: the last person turns off the light.



10. ENERGY-SAVING WASHING/DRYING

Wash clothes at the lowest possible temperature and wring at a lower speed. If possible, air dry your laundry rather than tumble dry it. If you don't have this option get a stand-alone dryer; combi dryers are up to 15% more energy efficient.



11. SHOWER INSTEAD OF BATH



By using energy-saving showerheads, you can cut your water consumption (and thus your energy consumption) in half. Stop the water when you are soaping up.

12. DON'T USE THE CHARGER AS A HEATER

Even a charger that is not connected to a phone or laptop usually consumes electricity and converts it into heat. This wastes up to ten times the energy actually needed for charging!





13. DO NOT LEAVE ELECTRONICS IN STAND-BY MODE

Your electronic equipment consumes a lot of electricity every year in standby mode.

Brazo De Mercedes by Carminy



Carmina comes from the Philippines and works as an FAE Senior Engineer. In 2009, she was sent to WSCZ as an OSS (on-site-support) employee. Since then, she has worked at various departments, from the repair line, through quality, to the current FAE team.

She met her husband - Reagan at WSPH, they live together in Brno and have two children - Meggie and Annie, who go to primary school and kindergarten. Their homework helps Carmina improve her Czech language proficiency.

Brazo de Mercedes is a traditional Filipino dessert that dates back to when Philippines was a Spanish colony. It is a type of rolled cake made from meringue and filled with custard.

Brazo de Mercedes if translated to Filipino literally means "arms of Mercedes" every time I prepare this cake my friends jokingly call this "Brazo de Carmina / Arms of Carmina" © but Brazo de Mercedes actually means "Arm of our Lady of Mercedes" in Spanish from Nuestra Señora de las Mercedes, a common devotional title for Mary-mother of Jesus. It is one of the desserts believed to have been the result of the repurposing of the discarded egg yolks from the use of egg whites for mortar and plaster in Spanish-Filipino colonial architecture.

What my children like about this cake the most is the meringue texture that is sponge like and the sweet flavour of the custard filling. At first, I was intimidated by the recipe as it seems too complicated but with few tries and practice I was able to create it exactly the way my husband and children love it. It also became our bonding moment when we prepare Brazo de Mercedes, Meggie already knows how to prepare it and she tries to add more powdered sugar for their sweet-rush. Happy cooking!

INGREDIENCE:

·10 large eggs ·1 teaspoon white vinegar ·1 teaspoon vanilla exctract ·¾ cup white crystal sugar ·3 tablespoons powdered sugar ·1 cup condensed milk (Salko Traditional)

IF EVERYTHING IS READY, WE CAN START BAKING:

Instructions:

1. .Separate egg yolk from egg white.

2. Meringue

a. Combine egg whites and white vinegar then beat using an electric mixer until soft peaks form.

b. Make the meringue by gradually adding the crystal white sugar while mixing the ingredients. Continue mixing until the texture is semi-firm

c. Preheat the oven to 170 $^\circ \! c.$

d. On a large baking pan, place baking sheet and grease the surface with oil spray .

e. Place the meringue on top of the greased baking sheet then spread evenly using a spatula.

f.Bake the meringue for 20 to 22 minutes or until the colour of the top part turns light to medium brown.

3. Custard Filling

a. While the meringue is in the oven, make the filling by combining the egg yolks and condensed milk in a small cooking pot. Apply heat and cook the mixture while continuously stirring until the texture becomes thick.

b. Add the vanilla extract to the condensed milk and egg yolk mixture, turn off the heat, and mix thoroughly.

c. Set aside.

4. Preparing/Rolling the Brazo de Mercedes

a. Remove the meringue from the oven and let it cool down for a few minutes.

b. Sprinkle the powdered sugar on top of the meringue then place wax paper on the top part of the meringue followed by a similar sized baking tray. The meringue should now be in the middle of two baking trays.

c. Flip the meringue: the new baking tray placed on top should now be on the bottom.

d. Remove the baking tray and the baking sheet (you should now see the opposite side of the baked meringue) then spread the filling over the meringue.

e .Roll the meringue. Complete rolling side to side starting at the longest side. Make sure that the layer with filling is rolled inward.

f. Put it on a serving plate and serve.

Children's group

Since September 1 of this year, two children's groups have been open.

The first group, Strawberry Popsicle, is intended for children from 1 to 2 years old, with a maximum capacity of 6 children.
